Vandals Hack Construction Message Sign

Vandals hacked a portable changeable message sign on the 91 Project in Corona on Christmas evening. The electronic sign located on northbound Interstate 15 between El Cerrito and Ontario Avenue in Corona was changed from a construction alert to a political message.

91 Project crews were not working on Christmas and were enjoying well deserved time with their families. The political message was replaced on December 26th when the crews came back to work.

Changeable message signs are critical for traffic safety and communication within the construction zone. Enhanced security measures will be implemented to protect the signs and the project from additional vandalism.

The Riverside County Transportation Commission's 91 Project is adding regular lanes, tolled express lanes, auxiliary lanes and direct express connectors from the northbound 15 to the westbound 91 and from the eastbound 91 to the southbound 15. Improvements to interchanges, ramps, lanes and surface streets also will be made along the 91 between the Riverside County/Orange County Line in Corona and Pierce Street in Riverside. The new lanes are expected to open in 2017.
